Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions

Rules: The series will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2005-2008, the Prescriptions of US Sailing, the Class Rules of the PHRF of Southern California, and this Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions. The races are PHRF Category 4.

Eligibility: The series is open to members of yacht clubs and sailing associations recognized by the Southern California Yachting Assoc. (SCYA) or US SAILING. Yachts in PHRF Classes must have a valid 2007 PHRF certificate.

Ratings: PHRF OWC ratings will be used without area adjustments.

Entries: Entries for the series trophies will be accepted through Wednesday, June 27, 2007. The entry form, the entry fee of \$30 payable to SSYC, and a copy of the boat's 2007 PHRF rating certificate should be mailed to SSYC. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee. Single race entries may be submitted up to 1200 hours of race day with an entry fee of \$10 per race.

Notice to Competitors, Changes in Sailing Instructions: There will be no competitor's meeting, only an informal gathering at SSYC at 1700 before each race (see also the "Trophies" information below). Any changes to this NOR/SI will be posted on the Race Notice Board at SSYC by 1700 hours on Race Day.

Class Breaks, Class Flags, and Order of Start: PHRF Spinnaker and One Design Classes will be established by the Race Committee. Class Breaks, Class Flags, and Order of Start will be posted on the SSYC Race Notice Boards by 1700 hours on Friday, June 29, 2007. They will also be displayed on the Race Committee boat prior to the first Warning.

Pre-Race Check-in: All boats must check-in with the SSYC Race Committee boat when it is anchored in the starting area displaying code flag "L" and will be recognized prior to the warning signal for the first start. Any boat failing to comply will be scored DNS.

Summer Sailing

Series

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The Start: The starting line will be in the general vicinity of Racing Buoy " N ", in the channel between the Pavilion and the Harbor Patrol docks. The start line will be between an orange flag on one end and an orange or red flag on or near the race committee boat. The race will be started using RRS 26. First Warning will be 1930 hours. Racers are to monitor Ch 68 for any announcement regarding any change to the starting area.

The Course: The Course Number will be displayed from the start boat. " Moonlight Madness " Course Charts will be available at SSYC on or before June 26, 2007, and on the SSYC website. Courses will be similar to those used in the BYC Sunkist Outside Series.

The Finish: The finish will be the same line as the start line, passing through it in the opposite direction as was done for the start.

Time Limit: The time limit will be 2330 hours. Boats failing to finish within the time limit, or within 30 minutes after the first boat in its class finishes, whichever is later, will be scored DNF (this modifies RRS 35).

Safety: Racing at night can be very challenging, and increased safety awareness is necessary. This regatta will require each crew member to wear a PFD at the start of the race. It is the ultimate responsibility of the skipper to determine the safety requirements on his boat after the start of the race.

Retiring: A competitor that has checked-in and subsequently retires from the race prior to finishing shall notify the Race Committee by hail or by VHF Channel 68 and be acknowledged before leaving the race course, or if that is impossible, shall contact the Race Committee at SSYC immediately upon arriving ashore. SSYC phone number is 949-646-3102.

Protests: A competitor intending to file a protest or request for redress shall notify the Race Committee on the finish boat and be acknowledged before leaving the finish area. A written protest or request for redress must be filed by the end of the day following the race to be eligible for a hearing.

Scoring: The Low Point Scoring System will be used. There will be one throw out for determining the series trophies.

Trophies: Trophies will be presented at SSYC at approx. 1800 hours on the next month' s race day. The July 28 presentations will be part of the SSYC Raft-up and Party in the anchorage area off of Lido Isle. August 25 and September 23 presentations will be at the SSYC clubhouse. Racers are encouraged to join SSYC for pre-race festivities at 1700 hours in the Dockside Room downstairs in the clubhouse prior to each race. Overall Series presentations will be done at a special brunch at SSYC on Sunday September 23 at 1100
